44 Arts Organizations Receive Operating Support Grants Exceeding \$379,000



Fairfax County, VA – The Arts Council of Fairfax County has awarded \$379,125 in Operating Support Grants to forty-four non-profit arts organizations in Fairfax County.

FY16 funded organizations offer a variety of arts disciplines including, dance, film, instrumental music, opera, theatre, visual art, and vocal music. Operating Support Grants were awarded to both emerging and established art organizations.

The Vienna Jammers was one of the newer organizations and received an Operating Support Grant for the first time. Since 2012, the Jammers have expanded from a small, after-school percussion ensemble to a professional world music percussion, music education, and performing arts organization for youth featuring four ensembles and a 90+ strong membership.
