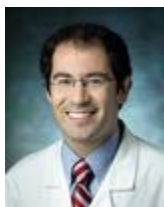

[Noah Scalin](#) is an artist, author, and activist. He founded Another Limited Rebellion in 2001 with the idea that he could make a living doing what he enjoyed and effect positive change in the world. Since then, Noah has traveled the world bringing his message of creative practice to everyone from incarcerated teenagers to Fortune 500 executives. In 2016 Noah was chosen as the first ever artist-in-residence at the Virginia Commonwealth University's School of Business.
